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Section-I: Instructions to Applicants

A. General

- 1. Scope of Application**
 - 1.1 In connection with the Invitation for Pre-qualification indicated in Section-II, Prequalification Data Sheet (PDS), the Contracting Authority, as defined in the **PDS**, issues this Prequalification Document (PQD) to applicants interested in bidding for the works described in Section-V, Scope of Works.
 - 1.2 The name of Project, procurement modality, and brief responsibilities of the private party (as concessionaire) are described in the **PDS**.
- 2. Source of Funds**
 - 2.1 Funding is to be arranged by the Applicant (as Concessionaire) in the form of Equity and Loan. However, the Government of Khyber Paktunkhwa shall partially arrange funds in the form of Viability Gap Funding (VGF).
 - 2.2 Requirement of incorporation of special purpose vehicle for the Project, as provided in the PDS.
- 3. Fraud and Corruption**
 - 3.1 The Contracting Authority requires that Applicants, Bidders, Suppliers, Contractors, and Consultants under these contracts, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts. In pursuit of this policy, the Contracting Authority:
 - (a) Defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - (i) “corrupt practice” means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution;
 - (ii) “fraudulent practice” means a mis-representation or omission of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract;
 - (iii) “collusive practice” means a scheme or arrangement between two or more bidders, with or without the knowledge of the Contracting Authority, designed to establish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels; and
 - (iv) “coercive practice” means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the procurement process or affect the execution of a contract;
 - (b) will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the Bidder recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract in question;
 - (c) will sanction a firm or individual, including declaring them ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, to be awarded a contract if it at any time determines that they have, directly or through an agent, engaged, in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for,

or in executing, a contract; and will have the right to require that a provision be included in Bidding Documents and requiring bidders, suppliers, contractors and consultants to permit the Contracting Authority to inspect their accounts and records and other documents relating to the bid submission and contract performance and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Contracting Authority.

4. Eligible Applicants

- 4.1 An Applicant shall be a private, public or government owned legal entity or any combination of them in the form of association(s) including Joint Venture (JV) with the formal intent, as evidenced by a letter of intent, to enter into an agreement or under an existing agreement. In the case of a JV, unless otherwise specified in the **PDS**, (i) all parties shall be jointly and severally liable, and (ii) there shall be no limit on the number of partners/members.
- 4.2 The eligibility criteria listed in this Clause 4 shall apply to the Applicant, including the parties constituting the Applicant, i.e., its proposed partners, subcontractors or suppliers for any part of the Contract including related services.
- 4.3 An Applicant and all parties constituting the Applicant shall have been registered with Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC) and shall have a valid registration Certificate in Category as mentioned in **PDS**.
- 4.4 Applicants and all parties constituting the Applicant shall not have a conflict of interest. Applicants shall be considered to have a conflict of interest if any of their partners participated as a Contracting Authority's consultant in the preparation of the design or technical specifications of the Works that are the subject of this prequalification. Where a firm, or a firm from the same economic or financial group, in addition to consulting, also has the capability to manufacture or supply goods or to construct works, that firm, or a firm from the same economic or financial group, cannot normally be a supplier of goods or works, if it provided consulting services for the contract corresponding to this prequalification, unless it can be demonstrated that there is not a significant degree of common ownership, influence or control.
- 4.5 An Applicant shall submit only one application in the same Prequalification process, either individually as an Applicant or as a partner of a joint venture. No Applicant can be a subcontractor while submitting an application individually or as a partner of a joint venture in the same Prequalification process. A Subcontractor in any application may participate in more than one application, but only in that capacity. An Applicant who submits, or participates in, more than one application will cause all the applications in which the Applicant has participated to be disqualified.
- 4.6 No Bid Security is required from the Applicants.
- 4.7 Applicants and all parties constituting the Applicant shall provide such evidence of their continued eligibility satisfactory to the Contracting Authority, as the Contracting Authority shall reasonably request.
- 4.8 In case of JVs, one of the partners who is responsible for performing a key function in contract management or is executing a major component of the proposed contract shall be nominated

as being in charge during the Prequalification and bidding periods and in the event of a successful bid, during contract execution. The partner in charge shall be authorized to incur liabilities and receive instructions for and on behalf of any and all partners of the joint venture; this authorization shall be evidenced by submitting a power of attorney signed by legally authorized signatories of all the partners.

B. Contents of the Prequalification Document

5. Sections of Prequalification Document

5.1 The document for the prequalification of Applicants (hereinafter - "prequalification document") consists of parts 1 and 2 which comprise all the sections indicated below, and should be read in conjunction with any Addendum issued in accordance with ITA 7.

PART 1 Prequalification Procedures

- Section-I. Instructions to Applicants (ITA)
- Section-II. Prequalification Data Sheet (PDS)
- Section-III. Qualification Criteria and Requirements
- Section-IV. Application Forms

PART 2 Works Requirements

- Section-V. Scope of Works

5.2 The "Invitation for Prequalification Applications" issued by the Contracting Authority is not part of the prequalification document.

5.3 The Contracting Authority accepts no responsibility for the completeness of the prequalification document and its addenda unless they were obtained directly from the Contracting Authority.

5.4 The Applicant is expected to examine all instructions, forms, and terms in the Prequalification Document and to furnish all information or documentation required by the Prequalification Document.

6. Clarification of Prequalification Document

6.1 A prospective Applicant requiring any clarification of the Prequalification Document shall contact the Contracting Authority in writing at the Contracting Authority's address indicated in the **PDS**. The Contracting Authority will respond in writing to any request for clarification provided that such request is received no later than five (05) days prior to the deadline for submission of applications. The Contracting Authority shall forward copies of its response to all applicants who have acquired the prequalification document directly from the Contracting Authority including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source. Should the Contracting Authority deem it necessary to amend the prequalification document as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under ITA 7 and in accordance with the provisions of ITA 16.2.

In order to provide opportunity to all interested applicants to seek clarification (if any), a Prequalification Conference shall be conducted by the Contracting Authority at the address and date indicated in the **PDS**.

7. **Amendment of Prequalification Document**
- 7.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of applications, the Contracting Authority may amend the Prequalification Document by issuing addenda.
- 7.2 Any addendum issued shall be part of the Prequalification Document and shall be communicated in writing to all who have obtained the prequalification document from the Contracting Authority.

C. Preparation of Applications

8. **Cost of Applications**
- 8.1 The Applicant shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its application. The Contracting Authority will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the prequalification process.
9. **Language of Application**
- 9.1 The application as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the prequalification exchanged by the Applicant and the Contracting Authority, shall be written in the language specified in the **PDS**. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the application shall also in same language.
10. **Documents Comprising the Application**
- 10.1 The application shall comprise the following:
- (a) Application Submission Form, in accordance with ITA 11;
 - (b) documentary evidence establishing the Applicant's eligibility to pre-qualify, in accordance with ITA 12;
 - (c) documentary evidence establishing the Applicant's qualifications, in accordance with ITA 13; and
 - (d) any other document required as specified in the **PDS**.
11. **Application Submission Form**
- 11.1 The Applicant shall prepare an Application Submission Sheet using the form furnished in Section-IV, Application Forms. This Form must be completed without any alteration to its format.
12. **Documents Establishing the Eligibility of the Applicant**
- 12.1 To establish its eligibility in accordance with ITA 4, the Applicant shall complete the eligibility declarations in the Application Submission Form and Forms ELI (eligibility) 1.1 and 1.2, included in Section-IV, Application Forms.
13. **Documents Establishing the Qualifications of the Applicant**
- 13.1 To establish its qualifications to perform the contract(s) in accordance with Section-III, Qualification Criteria and Requirements, the Applicant shall provide the information requested in the corresponding Information Sheets included in Section-IV, Application Forms.
14. **Signing of the Application and Number of Copies**
- 14.1 The Applicant shall prepare one original of the documents comprising the application as described in ITA 10 and clearly mark it "ORIGINAL". The original of the application shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by a person duly authorized to sign on behalf of the Applicant.
- 14.2 The Applicant shall submit copies of the signed original application, in the number specified in the **PDS**, and clearly mark them "COPY". In the event of any discrepancy between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.

D. Submission of Applications

- 15. Sealing and Identification of Applications**
- 15.1 The Applicant shall enclose the original and the copies of the application in a sealed envelope that shall:
- (a) bear the name and address of the Applicant;
 - (b) be addressed to the Contracting Authority, in accordance with ITA 16.1; and
 - (c) bear the specific identification of this prequalification process indicated in the **PDS 1.2**.
- 15.2 The Contracting Authority will accept no responsibility for not processing any envelope that was not identified as required.
- 16. Deadline for Submission of Applications**
- 16.1 Applications shall be received by the Contracting Authority at the address and no later than the deadline indicated in the **PDS**. A receipt will be given for all applications submitted. Applicants may always submit their applications by mail or by hand. When so specified in the **PDS**. Applicants shall also submit an electronic copy of their applications as specified in **PDS**.
- 16.2 The Contracting Authority may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of applications by amending the Prequalification Document in accordance with ITA 7, in which case all rights and obligations of the Contracting Authority and the Applicants subject to the previous deadline shall thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.
- 17. Late Applications**
- 17.1 The Contracting Authority may at its discretion, accept the application after the deadline for submission of applications prescribed in ITA 16.
- 18. Opening of Applications**
- 18.1 Contracting Authority shall open the applications as per its standard procedures and shall prepare a record of the opening of applications that shall include, as a minimum, the name of the Applicant. A copy of the record may be distributed to all Applicants.

E. Procedures for Evaluation of Applications

- 19. Confidentiality**
- 19.1 Information relating to the evaluation of applications, and recommendation for prequalification, shall not be disclosed to Applicants or any other persons not officially concerned with such process until the notification of results of prequalification is made to all Applicants.
- 19.2 From the deadline for submission of applications to the time of notification of the results of the prequalification in accordance with ITA 26, any Applicant that wishes to contact the Contracting Authority on any matter related to the prequalification process, may do so but only in writing.
- 20. Clarification of Applications**
- 20.1 To assist in the evaluation of applications, the Contracting Authority may, at its discretion, ask any Applicant for a clarification of its application which shall be submitted within a stated reasonable period of time. Any request for clarification and all clarifications shall be in writing.
- 20.2 If an Applicant does not provide clarifications of the information requested by the date and time set in the Contracting Authority's request for clarification, its application may be rejected.

21. **Responsiveness of Applications** 21.1 The Contracting Authority may reject any application which is not responsive to the requirements of the prequalification document.
22. **Subcontractors** 22.1 Applicants planning to subcontract any of the key activities indicated in Section-III, Qualification Criteria, shall specify the activity(ies) or parts of the works to be subcontracted in the Application Submission Form. Applicants shall clearly identify the proposed specialist subcontractors in Forms ELI-1.2 and EXP (experience)-4.2 in Section-IV. Such proposed specialist subcontractor(s) shall meet the corresponding qualification requirements specified in Section-III, Qualification Criteria and Requirements.
- 22.2 At this time, the Contracting Authority does not intend to execute certain specific parts of the Works by subcontractors selected in advance by the Contracting Authority (Nominated Subcontractors) unless otherwise stated in the **PDS**.

F. Evaluation of Applications and Prequalification of Applicants

23. **Evaluation of Applications** 23.1 The Contracting Authority shall use the factors, methods, criteria, and requirements defined in Section-III, Qualification Criteria and Requirements to evaluate the qualifications of the Applicants. The use of other methods, criteria, or requirements shall not be permitted.
- 23.2 The Contracting Authority shall also evaluate the performance of the applicant against its completed and ongoing projects. PKHA may disqualify the Applicant who has shown consistent bad performance.
- 23.3 Only the qualifications of subcontractors that have been identified in the application may be considered in the evaluation of an Applicant. However, the general experience and financial resources of subcontractors may not be added to those of the Applicant for purposes of prequalification of the Applicant.
- 23.4 In case of multiple contracts, the Contracting Authority shall pre-qualify each Applicant for the maximum number and types of contracts for which the Applicant meets the appropriate aggregate requirements of such contracts, as specified in Section-III, Qualification Criteria and Requirements.
24. **Contracting Authority's Right to Accept or Reject Applications** 24.1 The Contracting Authority reserves the right to accept or reject any application and to annul the prequalification process and reject all applications at any time by assigning cogent reason(s), without thereby incurring any liability to Applicants.
25. **Prequalification of Applicants** 25.1 The evaluation of the Applications will be carried out on "PASS" or "FAIL" threshold. The Application which meets all the "Must Meet" requirements shall be declared as "Pass / Qualified" and the Application which could not meet any of these "Must Meet" criteria shall be declared "Fail / Disqualified".

- 26. Notification of Prequalification** 26.1 Once the Contracting Authority has completed the evaluation of the applications it shall notify all Applicants in writing of the names of those applicants who have been pre-qualified.
- 27. Invitation to Bid** 27.1 Promptly after the notification of the results of the prequalification the Contracting Authority shall invite bids from all the Applicants that have been pre-qualified.
- 27.2 Bidders may be required to provide a Bid Security acceptable to the Contracting Authority in the form and amount to be specified in the Request for Proposal (RFP), and the successful Bidder shall be required to provide a Performance Security to be specified in the Request for Proposal (RFP).

SCOPE OF WORKS

THE PROJECT

Background

Pakistan is progressively enhancing its road infrastructure to increase road density and support regional and international trade for sustainable economic growth. This development also includes strengthening internal trade routes to improve connectivity of population centers in peripheral areas, enabling access to tourism potential, mining areas, and mineral resources. Pakistan is endowed with substantial reserves of minerals and natural resources, the effective utilization of which depends heavily on an efficient and reliable transport network.

In this context, the Pakhtunkhwa Highways Authority (PKHA) aims to improve accessibility in far-flung areas by integrating them with the national highway and motorway network, thereby unlocking their economic potential. As part of a broader provincial development program, the Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa intends to construct a controlled-access, high-speed road corridor linking the northern and southern parts of the province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

To achieve this objective, the Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, through PKHA, has launched an ambitious communication sector project: **the construction of the Peshawar–Dera Ismail Khan Motorway, approximately 360 km in length**. The motorway will provide a direct, high-capacity north–south linkage and is envisaged to play a pivotal role in regional connectivity.

Segments of Peshawar – Dera Ismail Khan Motorway

The Peshawar – Dera Ismail Khan Motorway (PDM) corridor includes **19 interchanges**, creating **18 sub-segments** between consecutive interchanges. For investment structuring and commercial assessment, these 18 sub-segments are consolidated into **8 bankable project segments** (with and without Tunnel Cases), based on traffic density, constructability, and packaging efficiency for procurement and financing. **The 8 segments (Sections) with their respective lengths are as follows:**

Segment–08: Yarik to Qureshi Mor (39.5 km) ("The Project")

Segment–08 starts from the Yarik Interchange, located adjacent to the endpoint of the Hakla–D.I. Khan Motorway, and terminates at the Qureshi Mor Interchange, which marks the End of Project (EOP). This segment connects the proposed motorway with the existing road network of D.I. Khan.

The alignment passes through the D.I. Khan Interchange and intersects with National Highway N-50 (Zhob–Quetta), providing a strategic link between Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan. This segment is critical for regional integration, long-haul freight transportation, and overall corridor efficiency.
